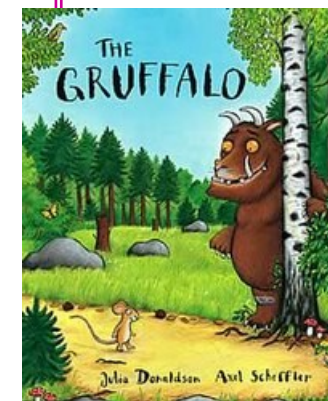


Personal, Social, Emotional Development
